We have been successful in obtaining a \$1000 Sporting Schools Grant from the Australian Government. Our chosen sport this term is Golf. Over the past two weeks we have been reading books by Mem Fox. Ruby this week had the class enthralled reading Wilfred Gordon McDonald Partridge by Mem Fox. It was a beautiful story about memories.
